

The Great Betrayal – Judas - Sept 6th 2020

John 18:1-9, When he had finished praying, Jesus left with his disciples and crossed the Kidron Valley. On the other side there was a garden, and he and his disciples went into it. ² Now Judas, who betrayed him, knew the place, because Jesus had often met there with his disciples. ³ So Judas came to the garden, guiding a detachment of soldiers and some officials from the chief priests and the Pharisees. They were carrying torches, lanterns and weapons.

Do you think Judas started out fully devoted to Jesus but became less interested over time?

⁴ Jesus, knowing all that was going to happen to him, went out and asked them, "Who is it you want?" ⁵ "Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "I am he," Jesus said. (And Judas the traitor was standing there with them.) ⁶ When Jesus said, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground. ⁷ Again he asked them, "Who is it you want?" "Jesus of Nazareth," they said. ⁸ Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. If you are looking for me, then let these men go." ⁹ This happened so that the words he had spoken would be fulfilled: "I have not lost one of those you gave me."

Luke 22: 39-44, Jesus Prays on the Mount of Olives, ³⁹ Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and his disciples followed him. ⁴⁰ On reaching the place, he said to them, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation." ⁴¹ He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, ⁴² "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." ⁴³ An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. ⁴⁴ And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground. ⁴⁵ When he rose from prayer and went back to the disciples, he found them asleep, exhausted from sorrow. ⁴⁶ "Why are you sleeping?" he asked them. "Get up and pray so that you will not fall into temptation."

John 18:10-14, ¹⁰ Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, cutting off his right ear. (The servant's name was Malchus.) ¹¹ Jesus commanded Peter, "Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?" Then the detachment of soldiers with its commander and the Jewish officials arrested Jesus. They bound him ¹³ and brought him first to Annas, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the high priest that year. ¹⁴ Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jewish leaders that it would be good if one man died for the people.

The Great Betrayal - Judas

READ: John 18:1-3

1. What do we know about Judas?

KEY QUESTION: Do you think Judas started out fully devoted to Jesus but became less interested over time? Take time to discuss this.

2. We know Judas's betrayal was premeditated and plotted over an extended period of time maybe well over a year. What can we learn from this?

READ: John 12:3-5

3. What was wrong with this?

READ: John 12:6, Matthew 26:14-16

4. Motives make a difference. Do you think Judas was just a bad guy or a guy who slowly lost his way? Consider these possibilities: Judas was greedy.

Judas had something against Jesus. Judas was fearful, angry that his Messiah wasn't properly following Torah, upset that Jesus wasn't becoming the ruler he thought he would, or Judas could not control Jesus or motivate him to be how he wanted Jesus to be?

READ: John 18:4-9

- 5. What happens here?
- 6. Why does Jesus step between His disciples and danger? Why did Jesus do this?

KEY POINT: Jesus protects his followers.

READ: Luke 22: 39-42

- 7. What does Jesus ask of His Father?
- 8. Have you been there in life? Life just isn't going well, in fact maybe life is awful, something happens you cannot control, change or even wrap your head around. How do you respond when you feel like you cannot make it through? How do you respond when you don't know what to do? Do you ask for an out? Or for the strength to endure?

A Quote from Pastor Adam...Jesus asked God the Father for help and was honest about how he felt, but he did not stop there. He continued with these words, "yet not my will, but yours be done." Jesus is saying, but Father I know life is not about my personal desires, not about me just having a good time, not about me always being happy, not about me always having my desires fulfilled. Jesus says instead, there is a greater purpose to life, and I would rather lean into that life then into my fleshly desires. Is that how you respond? Are you there yet in your relationship with God that you would rather have God's will happen in your life than your will?

READ: The Quote above and answer the questions it poses.

NOW READ Luke 22:43-46

9. How did Jesus respond as he did? How was Jesus so calm in the face of what was coming?

KEY POINT: Jesus was aligned with God the Father.

10. How can you respond the right way in life? How can you be calm in the face of any hardship?

READ: John 18:10-14

11. Who is in charge of the outcome from beginning to end?

KEY POINT: He "came into the world" by His own choice. He took upon himself the form of a servant... by His own choice. For the sake of all people He willingly humbled Himself. Step by step He voluntarily journeyed towards His arrest. From the beginning of Jesus' life this was His destiny. Made necessary by His love for us! Think about this and discuss.

12. Have you grown cold to Jesus over the years?
