

MAKE IT YOUR OWN

Definition of Salvation: The saving of your soul from sin and its consequences.

Am I sinful? Read: Romans 3:23

What are the consequences of my sin? Read: Romans 6:23

Who, out of God's great love for me, was sent to save me from my sin? Read: John 3:16, Acts 4:12, and John 14:6

What can I do to be saved? Read: Ephesians 2:8-9, Romans 10:9-10, and Acts 2:21

How can I be sure I am saved?

- 1. God doesn't force this free gift of salvation or eternal destination of heaven on you but gives you an option to receive it. Simply choose it.
- 2. You have to acknowledge your sinful nature, repent (express regret and turn away from) your sin, place your belief in the Lord Jesus and His finished work on the cross, and surrender to Him as your Lord and Savior.
- 3. Salvation happens the moment someone receives Jesus into their life! The promise of eternal life with God and a heaven-bound future is found in your salvation—no matter how bad your past was, Jesus has wiped your slate clean!

Have you prayed a prayer to receive Jesus in your heart? If not, there's no better time than now. The Bible tells us in 2 Corinthians 6:2, "...Today is the day of salvation." Pray the prayer below, believing it in your heart.
