March 5 <sup>th</sup> , 2023 Highlights of Acts 1-11
<b>Act 1:13-14,</b> When they arrived, they went upstairs to the room where they were staying. Those present were Peter, John, James and Andrew; Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew;
James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. They all joined together
constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers. In
those days Peter stood up among the believers (a group numbering about a hundred and twenty)
Jesus' first church started with people.
Acts 2:1-4, When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound
like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were
sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them
All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled
them.
Acts 2:5-13, Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under
heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are
speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? Parthians,
Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia
and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and
converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own
tongues!"
Acts 2:41, Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added
to their number that day.
Acts 4:1-4, The priests and the captain of the temple guard and the Sadducees came up to Peter
and John while they were speaking to the people. They were greatly disturbed because the apostles
were teaching the people, proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead. They seized Peter and
John and, because it was evening, they put them in jail until the next day. But many who heard the
message believed; so the number of men who believed grew to about five thousand.
Acts 4:13, When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled,
ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.  God work through if I let!

Acts 7:59, While they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he fell on his knees and cried out, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he fell asleep.
