## The Indwelling of the Spirit

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Life, via the Spirit of God

"It is because of this power of 'life' within us that we can be certain of future resurrection. Our bodies may be doomed to die, but the Spirit, the Spirit of life, the Spirit of the God who raised our Lord Jesus from the dead, dwells within us and guarantees that our bodies will not end in the grave. God, through the Spirit, will give life to those bodies again."

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The Future Resurrection for those Indwelt by the Spirit

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True Easter faith is the work of the Spirit, for believing in Christ's resurrection doesn't mean affirming a historical fact, and saying 'Oh really?' It means being seized by the life-giving Spirit and experiencing 'the powers of the world to come' (Heb. 6.5) in our own living and dying. There is no Pentecost without Easter. That is obvious. But there is no Easter without Pentecost either. There is no Easter theology without a theology of Pentecost, and no Pentecost theology without Easter theology.
