Romans 4:19 – 25, And not being weak in faith, he did not consider his own body, already dead (since he was about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰ He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, ²¹ and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform. ²² And therefore "it was accounted to him for righteousness."

²³Now it was not written for his sake alone that it was imputed to him, ²⁴ but also for us. It shall be imputed to us who believe in Him who raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵ who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification.

2 Timothy 2:2, And the things that you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also.

During Timothy's many years of close association with Paul

Timothy was to take the Truth he had learned from Paul and teach it to other faithful men men with proven spiritual character and giftedness, who would in turn pass on those truths to another generation.

From Paul to Timothy to faithful men to others encompasses 4 generations of godly leaders. That process of spiritual reproduction, which began in the early church, is to continue until the Lord returns.

Commit -

Faithful – dependable, loyal, trustworthy, responsible

2. The Intentional Expectation

commit these to faithful men

- Good relationships both comfort and stretch.
- In these type relationships, the heat rises and the sparks fly.
- We're not after behavior modification but biblical transformation.

Three ways you can help or be helped...

1. Be available.

We are all busy.

Don't buy into the lie that young men don't want your help

2. Be purposeful.

Consider – think through ways where life works for you—with Christ, at work, home, financially, in ministry, wherever.

3. Be real.

Don't fake it.

The struggle and the battle is real—and you need to be real before you will ever be able to help a man or be helped by a man.

On either side of the table – you both need to decide what kind of man you want to be.

3. The Transformational Execution

Equip – train, arm, furnish, give

2. Unprocessed Trauma

loss of a job divorce wayward child

3. Lack of a Manhood Vision

quessing at manhood

it's hard to be what you cannot define

where there is no vision the people perish — the people run wild

4. Addictive Habits (alcohol//drugs//porn)

5. No Close Friends
