Compromise: Defined

1.To settle a dispute by mutual concession.

2.Accept standards that are lower than is desirable for both parties.

- make a deal
- make concessions

- strike a balance
- give and take

The Question is NOT "IF" you will be faced with COMPROMISE situation, but "WHEN".

The Question IS, <u>"HOW"</u> will I address a COMPROMISE Situation?

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Compromise from the World's Perspective

- The world expects compromise as a part of normal societal advance.
- Failure to compromise is seen as hardline, conservative, ultrareligious, and hateful.
- The Christian Worldview is belittled and scoffed at every level.
- Failure to lower Christian standards is seen as "Un-Christian".

From a Young Christian Businessman This Week:

"I'm not sure that a standard of business ethics exists anymore. I am simply expected to do whatever it takes to get the sale for my company."

Typical Male Attitudes:

- 2nd Place is the 1st loser...
- If you are not willing to cheat, you do not want to win bad enough.
- Winning is everything.
- He who dies with the most toys, WINS.
- WIN at ALL cost.
- FAILURE is NOT and OPTION.

If You Are Not the Lead Dog, the View NEVER Changes



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A "Compromise" results in a condition or state in which God's best for our lives is diminished, damaged, or destroyed. When I compromise, I Choose to lower God's standards.

A "Compromise" is a personal/intentional negotiation with God.

We try to justify/align our "options", CHOOSING to ignore "the right thing".

Satan LOVES when we CHOOSE to compromise... Collateral damage is eminent—hurting those that we love most AND potentially triggering cascading events to cover the compromise.

Compromise has a cost...

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God, God's ways, God's Law, God's Word, and God's Standards are UNCHANGING and UNCHANGEABLE—regardless of our current wants/desires. Period.

For This We Must Be Thankful!

The Compromise Steps

- An event that may have a personal impact (positive or negative) on you arises, or an "opportunity" to experience pleasure arises.
- You quickly weigh the impact/opportunities, risk, risk of being caught, the potential for apparent success or pleasure—against what you know is right ("Right" being based on God's Word and Biblical teaching).
- You CHOOSE.

Compromise Scenarios

- Family
- Relationships
- Sanctity of Marriage
- Spiritual Health
- Christian Walk
- Christian Service

There is always a focus on "I" in every CompromIse.

I want something so bad, that I am willing to ignore what I know is right-- risking the consequences to achieve my current desire/need.

Christian Compromise

When I compromise in my life, I am declaring that:

- I am not willing to wait on God
- I am not willing to trust God
- I am not going to obey God

I want "it" now...

Again, "It" may be pleasure, gain, glory, or perceived advantage.

Solomon-The Wisest Man, A Compromising Man

- 1 Kings 11: 1-8
- Wisdom is the <u>right application</u> of true knowledge, and compromise erodes it quickly- Psalms 111:10
- Solomon later declared-- Proverbs 14:12
- Solomon's precedent was harmful to Israel years after.

Biblical Examples of No-Compromise Victory

- Jesus; Matt 4:1-11
- Nehemiah; Neh 2: 18-20
- Peter and John; Acts 4: 19,20
- Joseph; Gen 39: 1-12

Avoiding Compromise DOES NOT require isolation. Jesus' Example of Everyday Walk Romans 12:2

- He invited in and associated with the worst of SINNERS.
- He loved SINNERS.
- He ministered to SINNERS.
- In the process, He NEVER lowered God's STANDARDS in the process.

Preventing Compromise Requires a Strategy

- Jesus used the living Word—knowing that He was the Savior of the world.
- Nehemiah focused on his charge to rebuild the walls—unwilling to accept the condition of his countrymen.
- Peter and John were committed to God—at any cost, even at the threat of death.
- Joseph relied on God's promise and a strong commitment to integrity.

Preventing Compromise Requires A Close Walk

- Quiet time
- Scripture memory
- Holy Spirit filled
- Obedience
- A willing heart
- A humble heart

We CANNOT WIN, if we are not equipped and provisioned!

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The Ideal State of Heart-Proverbs 30

⁷ "Two things I ask of you, LORD; do not refuse me before I die:
⁸ Keep falsehood and lies far from me; give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread.
⁹ Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you

and say, 'Who is the LORD?' Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God.

The Ultimate Question

Matt 16:26 What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?

- Am I willing compromise away my Christian victory?
- Am I willing to compromise away God's best for me?

The Ultimate Response

Matt 6:33 But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

- Trust/Seek God
- Steadfastly EXECUTE His ways
- God's BEST is the ABSOLUTE BEST
