The Heart of a Leader

(Qualities That Set Leaders Apart From Others)

In Psalm 78:72, the Bible says about David that *“he shepherded them according to the integrity of his heart and guided them by the skillfulness of his hands”*

The Leader God Uses...

- I. Has a Great Purpose in Life
(Phil 3:7-14)
 - Discovering of your purpose
 - Discipling of your purpose
 - Determined in your purpose
- II. Has By God's Grace, Removed Any Hindrances From His Life
(Heb 12:1-2)
 - Develop personal disciplines
 - Develop personal security and identity
 - Develop personal convictions
- III. Has Placed Himself Absolutely At God's Disposal
(Rom 12:1-2)
 - We have nothing to prove
 - We have nothing to lose
 - We have nothing to hide
- IV. Has Learned How To Prevail in Prayer
(James 5:13-17)
 1. ASK (prayer of faith)
 2. SEEK (prayer of dedication)
 3. KNOCK (prayer of intercession)
- V. Is A Student of God's Word
(2 Tim 3:16-17 & 2 Tim 2:15)
 - We need to learn it
 - We need to love it
 - We need to live it
- VI. Has A Vital Life Changing Message For A Lost World
(Phil 2:16)
 - In Rom 1:14-16 Paul said
 - I am obligated (v 14)
 - I am eager (v 15)
 - I am not ashamed (v 16)

VII. Has A Faith That Expects Results

(Rom 4:19-21)

- Many of the men and women of Faith in the Bible had:
- Vision
- Confidence
- Hunger
- Resolve
- Dreams

VIII. Chooses To Serve In Attitude And Action

(Phil 2:5-8)

1. He did not cling to His position, rather to His purpose
2. He was not position conscious but purpose conscious

IX. Stirs Up The Gifts In Themselves And Others

(I Tim 4:13-16)

- First, a leader identifies a primary gift
- Second, they develop that gift
- Third, match that gift with a place of service
- Fourth, that gift provides a platform
- Finally, the leader flourishes because of their gift

X. Is Secure Enough To Empower Others

(John 13:3-5)

- Secure leaders focus on towels, insecure ones focus on titles
- Secure leaders get strength from identity, insecure ones from images
- Secure leaders pursue service to others, insecure ones pursue status with others
- Secure leaders add value to others, insecure ones gain value from others

XI. Lives Under The Anointing Of The Holy Spirit

- Anointed leaders possess spiritual authority with others
- Anointed leaders consistently see God move in their ministries
- Anointed leaders lives demand a supernatural explanation
