James 1:1

Text: James 1:1 (NKJV) — 1 James, a bondservant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes which are scattered abroad: Greetings.

Take Away: James is zealous to help us see that Christian confession must be linked with a Chrisitan way of life. Genuine Christian faith must be a real and living faith that comes out of our fingertips. The evidence of the genuineness of one's faith is born out through the refining fire of trials.
