

DNA

We will now look into how to structure your Life Groups through shared leadership. There will always be a person that takes the lead inside of a DNA. This person will be designated as the DNA Leader.

Leader's responsibilities for the DNA:

- Coordinate meetings with DNA to discuss how the Life Group will proceed.
 - What is our mission?
 - Who should we be training to be a Life Group leader?
 - How will we accomplish our mission?
 - Where will we meet?
 - What is the health of our group?
 - What curriculum will we study?
- Designate leadership responsibilities to other DNA members.
 - Who is leading Group discussion from week to week?
 - Who's house will we meet at?
 - What each Group member of the DNA is accountable for?

A DNA is made up of three people within a Life Group to form the Leadership. The Leader, Co-Leader and Apprentice. Christ modeled this for us in his life. He would often pull away from the larger group of disciples and bring 3 with him: Peter, James and John. He had a group that he drew closest to and prayed with and allowed them to be part of a more intimate relationship with him. The DNA's are like the nucleus of an atom. They are central to Life Groups, and as such, should meet together weekly.
