

Mercy and Intentionality	
This parable calls us to reflect on two things:	
God's toward us: He didn't stumble upon us. He so pursued us when we were hiding, hurting, or hardened.	ught us out. He

Our call to pursue others: Jesus models	
He didn't avoid sinners—He went to them. And He calls us to do the	e same.
Not with judgment, but with mercy.	
Not with condemnation, but with compassion.

Notice the shift: when all ten coins were present, there was no celebration. But when one was lost and then found—there's rejoicing!
