Welcome

Liturgical Rhythms for Everyday Life

This prayer guide is offered with the hope that it will serve as a gentle companion in your walk with Jesus throughout the season of Ordinary Time.

This project is rooted in a simple conviction: we are formed not only by what we believe, but by what we practice. The habits we keep shape our desires, our attention, and ultimately our lives. As a church, we believe the rhythms of gathered worship are meant to spill over into the week, becoming patterns that help form us into the likeness of Christ.

Each day of this guide offers a different liturgically inspired practice—a rhythm we engage in together on Sundays, now extended into daily life. These aren't tasks to check off, but invitations to slow down, pay attention, and grow in communion with God over time.

The Scripture readings follow the Revised Common Lectionary Daily Readings, used by churches around the world, with the addition of our Sunday sermon texts on Saturdays and Sundays. All passages are from the New International Version (NIV), 2011 edition.

This guide is meant to be flexible. Use it in the morning, evening, or whenever it fits into your day. It can be used individually or in a group setting. However you engage it, our prayer is that it leads you into deeper rest, attentiveness, and joy in God's presence.

For Families:

Let these rhythms shape your life together. Consider weaving one or two practices into moments you already share—a meal prayer, bedtime routine, or time in the car. You might say or sing the Doxology, confess sin and receive grace together, or read and reflect on the psalm of the day. Don't feel the need to do it all. Start small, and allow these simple practices to quietly shape your family, joining the movements that have formed the church throughout the centuries.



Encountering God in the Ordinary

Ordinary Time invites us to rediscover the sacred in the everyday. While the church calendar has its feasts and fasts, this season unfolds in the regular rhythms of life—morning routines, grocery runs, shared meals, quiet walks. And yet, God is just as present here as in any holy day.

Early Christians spoke of God revealing himself in two books: the book of Scripture and the book of creation. While the word of God grounds us, the world around us also bears witness to his beauty, strength, and presence.

This season is a chance to slow down and pay attention—to let work, rest, and play become places of prayer. Wherever you find yourself, may you listen for God's voice in the ordinary. He delights to meet you there.

Practice

Faithfulness in the Everyday

Tish Harrison Warren once wrote, “What I need courage for is the ordinary, the daily everydayness of life.” Most of us can relate. We’re not usually battling dragons—we’re making lunches, commuting to work, replying to emails, changing diapers, or caring for aging parents. The real challenge isn’t surviving a crisis, it’s remaining present and faithful in the quiet repetition of our days.

Kathleen Norris calls this tension a “quotidian mystery”—that the daily grind we often resist is also where salvation is worked out. And Dallas Willard reminds us that “God has yet to bless anyone except where they actually are.” Not where we wish we were. Not once we figure everything out. But here. Now.

That’s why practicing the presence of God is so vital in Ordinary Time. It’s a spiritual discipline that trains us to see God in the midst of our regular lives, not apart from them. As Adele Calhoun writes, “Practicing the presence is the discipline of learning to live all of life as an act of communion with God.” This means cultivating awareness that God is with us in the slow commute, the long meeting, the pile of dishes, and the awkward conversation. Nothing is too mundane for his presence.

Where You Are

Throughout this season, I'd encourage you to choose one ordinary activity—washing your hands, making coffee, walking to your car—and use it as a cue to become aware of God's presence. You might pray a short breath prayer like, "Here I am, Lord" or "You are with me." Or simply take three slow breaths and remember that Christ is near.

Try doing this once a day. Then notice: How does this small moment shape the rest of your day? What changes when you remember that God is with you—even here?

Ordinary Time invites us into this kind of slow, faithful noticing. We don't need to chase mountaintop moments or wait for life to feel extraordinary. God meets us in the everyday. Especially there.

For Parents:

Consider choosing a regular moment in your family's day to notice God together—at the breakfast table, while driving to school, or during bedtime. It doesn't need to be long or elaborate. Ask your kids, "Where did you see God's goodness today?" or share one way you noticed his presence. These small, consistent moments can help weave an awareness of God into the rhythm of everyday life.
