Devotional — “There Is More”

Scripture:

Acts 2:38–39 — “Repent, and be baptized every one of you... and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. For the promise is unto you...”

Pentecost reveals a truth that runs from Exodus to Acts: God’s desire was never simply to save people *from* something—but to fill them *with* Himself. In the Old Testament, His law was written on stone. At Pentecost, it was written on the human heart.

The Spirit-filled life is not a bonus feature of Christianity; it is God’s intended completion of His work in us. And the message of Scripture is unmistakable: **there is more that God wants you to experience.** More power, more clarity, more transformation, more intimacy, more leading, and more of His presence dwelling within you.

The Holy Spirit empowers believers to pray God’s will (Rom. 8:26–27), gives supernatural boldness (Acts 2:14), and produces a prayer language that appears consistently in Acts when believers were filled (Acts 2, 10, 19).

Pentecost teaches us to live hungry, open, and surrendered—because God always has more.

Reflection Question

Where have I settled spiritually, and where is the Spirit calling me to desire “more”?

Prayer Steps to Invite The Holy Spirit To Live In You!

Take 5 minutes (or as much time as you need) today and practice these intentional steps:

1. Invite the Spirit

Pray: *“Holy Spirit, I welcome You today. Lead me.”*

2. Repent (Acts 2:38)

Take a quiet moment to examine your heart.

Pray: *“Lord, forgive me for anything in my life that is not pleasing to You. Cleanse my heart, renew my mind, and help me turn fully toward You.”*

Repentance is not condemnation—it is preparation. It makes room for God to fill you.

3. Worship Out Loud

Speak words of praise—even simple ones like “Hallelujah,” “Thank You, Jesus,” or “I love You, Lord.”

This softens the heart and opens the mouth in faith.

4. Yield to the Spirit

If you feel the prompting, begin praying in the Spirit.

If not, continue worshiping with openness and expectation.

5. Close With Expectancy

Pray: *“Lord, thank You that there is more of You available to me—and I want everything You have.”*

Family Devotional — “The Promise Is for Our Home”

Scripture:

Acts 2:39 — “The promise is for you and *your children...*”

Devotional Thought:

Pentecost wasn’t just for adults—it was God’s way of saying, “*I want to be close to your whole family.*” The Holy Spirit didn’t fall on one special person; He came to everyone in the room. God loves meeting with families!

Imagine the scene: a sound like a rushing wind, flames that didn’t burn, and people praising God in languages they had never learned. It was like the whole room came alive! And guess what? God still moves in homes today—quietly, gently, and powerfully.

Kids, teens, parents—everyone—can experience God’s presence. He wants your home to be a place filled with peace, joy, prayer, and moments where you say, “*God is here with us.*” When we make room for Him, He fills our living rooms the same way He filled that upper room.

Family Question:

Where in our home can we make just a little more room for God this week?

Family Action Step for This Week

Take 3 minutes as a family to pray together. Keep it simple and fun:

1. **Everyone shares one short thing they’re thankful for.**

2. **Optional kid-friendly addition:** Everyone says one word that describes what they want more of (joy, peace, courage, kindness, strength, etc.).
3. **Each person prays a short prayer, including what they're thankful for and the "more" they want to see in their lives:**
"Dear Lord, thank you that you came and died for us. Fill our home with more joy this week..."

This tiny habit teaches your children that God is not far away—He shows up when families come together.

Family Prayer:

"Lord, thank You that Your promise is for our whole family. Fill our home with Your Spirit. Help us love each other, listen to You, and grow closer to You every day. We make room for You, Jesus—together. Amen."
