

Psalm 19 Cœli enarrant



- 1 <u>The heavens</u> declare the <u>glory</u> of <u>God</u>, and the <u>firmament shows</u> his <u>handiwork</u>.
- 2 One day tells its <u>tale</u> to an<u>other</u>, and one night imparts <u>knowledge</u> to an<u>other</u>.
- 3 Although they have no words or language, and their voices are not heard,
- 4 Their <u>sound</u> has gone <u>out</u> into all <u>lands</u>, and their <u>message</u> to the <u>ends</u> of the <u>world</u>.
- 5 <u>In</u> the deep has he set a <u>pavilion</u> for the <u>sun</u>; <u>it</u> comes forth like a bridegroom out of his <u>chamber</u>; it rejoices like a champion to run its <u>course</u>.
- 6 It goes forth from the uttermost edge of the <u>heavens</u> and runs about to the end of it <u>again</u>; nothing is <u>hidden</u> from its burning <u>heat</u>.
- 7 The law of the LORD is perfect, and revives the soul; the testimony of the LORD is sure, and gives wisdom to the innocent.
- The <u>statutes</u> of the LORD are <u>just</u>, and rejoice the <u>heart</u>; the com<u>mandment</u> of the LORD is <u>clear</u>, and gives light to the <u>eyes</u>.
- 9 The fear of the LORD is clean, and endures for ever; the judgments of the LORD are true, and righteous altogether.
- 10 More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, sweeter far than honey, than honey in the comb.
- 11 <u>By</u> them also is your <u>servant</u> en<u>lightened</u>, <u>and</u> in <u>keeping</u> them there is great re<u>ward</u>.
- 12 Who can tell how often he offends? cleanse me from my secret faults.
- 13 <u>Above</u> all, keep your <u>servant</u> from presumptuous <u>sins</u>; <u>let</u> them not get do<u>minion over</u> me; <u>Then</u> shall I be <u>whole</u> and <u>sound</u>, and <u>innocent</u> of a <u>great</u> of <u>fense</u>.
