
# Traditional Worship

O God, whose blessed Son made himself known to his disciples in the breaking of bread: Open the eyes of our faith, that we may behold him in all his redeeming work; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen. (from the Book of Common Prayer) Doxology with Alleluias is a departure from the normal setting of our doxology (whose tune is "Old Hundredth"). The departure is purposeful, however, and many churches do this. "Alleluia" is the Latin derivation of the Hebrew "Hallelujah," which means, "Praise the Lord." We sing the Doxology with Alleluias during the season of Easter (which includes Easter Sunday and the six weeks following) because the height of our joy and the culmination of Christ's work and our faith are found in His resurrection from the dead. The "alleluias" almost burst forth from our doxology in a "we can't help but shout out Your praises, Lord" sort of way, because Easter brings such exciting news!
