Is the idea of kingship lost on us? It's worth thinking about the fact that the idea of "king" to us seems antiquated and historical. Though a valuable idea, perhaps our modern democracy has allowed us to forget that we *actually* sit under the kingship and authority of Christ, who *really* rules over us as a king rules over His subjects and kingdom. What, then, might be the implications for our daily life if we were to *truly* live out what it means for Jesus to be King of our lives?
