Why We Need to Lament in Worship. Corporate worship really is the starting place for our spirituality. How we relate to God as a body of people in worship shapes how we relate to God the other six days of the week as individuals. In this sense, worship gives us a "vocabulary" and a set of tools with which to relate to God. So what happens if worship doesn't give us a roadmap for how to relate to God when we are suffering? Two things usually happen. Either (1) We grow bitter toward God because we don't have any categories for relating to God in pain; or (2) We doubt God's goodness, sincerity, or even His existence. Worship without lament has the ill effect of subconsciously teaching us that pain and suffering must not be of or from the Lord, that they are outside His will, or (worse yet) they are manifestations of God's punishment of our sin (which is an affront to God's free grace in Christ, because he settled that at the cross!). The Psalms—God's only fully inspired, truly infallible songbook-are filled with lamentation, and through them, we learn to pray our tears and anxieties. We are given a vocabulary of worship through (not in spite of) suffering.
