





How is the way we are consuming the news forming our families, shaping our hearts and minds and impacting how we love our neighbors?






THE PACE OF THE NEWS



Thoreau warns that the increased abundance and speed of the news threaten to fragment our attention and damage our ability to see what is really happening and to think rightly about these events. As Josef Pieper puts it, in making a parallel argument, "The average person of our time loses the ability to see because there is too much to see!"
