But God didn't design corporate worship to be just one other option. Worship is not a "product on a shelf." It is God's way of blessing us and giving us spiritual strength. No wonder we're admonished in Hebrews 10:25:

"Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

This new year, let's choose *not* to make worship a commodity. Let's choose to respond to Christ's grace and love on the cross by being faithful to, as our membership vow states, to "promise to serve Christ in His Church by supporting and participating with this congregation in its service of God and its ministry to others to the best of your ability."

Why the Christian Calendar? Not every church follows the church year, also called the "liturgical cycle."
