If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshiping with us on this Sunday morning.

It All Begins at the End. "In order to begin our Lenten journey, we go straight to the end. Our beginning as Christians is at precisely the same place which was the end for Jesus. Just outside Jerusalem, right by a garbage dump, on a Roman cross, with two criminals on either side of him. For several hours he had hung there. the last bits of the perfect life he had lived to the glory of God the Father draining out of him. Finally he spoke a single word, and that was the end. That one word, spoken at the end of Jesus' earthly life, represents the beginning of everything we are as Christians. That one word changes everything. "Tetelestai". It is finished. But what is finished?

-Sin is finished. Most people think of sin as something that makes us bad, and they think of the Christian life as about learning to be good, or at least learning to be better people than we are now. Not so. The reality is that sin makes us dead. That's a problem. Because dead people can't do anything to improve themselves. They may think they can, but they can't. Jesus did not come down to earth and die on a cross so that bad people might become good or that good people might become better. He came so that dead people might become alive.
