Reformation Sunday. On October 31, 1517, a young monk posted 95 propositions for theological debate on the castle church door in the town of Wittenberg, Germany. Martin Luther intended to provoke discussions to improve the understanding of the Christian faith and deepen the faith of believers. Instead, he initiated what became known as the Protestant Reformation, which gave birth not only to protestant churches, but also to many thoughtful theological works.

A Mighty Fortress is Our God
The single most powerful hymn of
the Reformation was "A Mighty
Fortress Is Our God." Both the text
(based on Psalm 46) and the tune
for this hymn were written by Martin Luther in 1529. During a time
of persecution, this song became a
declaration of faith and a source of
strength. One of the benefits of the
reformation was the revitalization of
congregational singing. People were
encouraged to lift their voices both
to declare their personal faith and to
unite with one another in worship.
