At the age of fifty-seven, he wrote the hymn "Great is Thy Faithfulness," based on the verses in Lamentations that say, "His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness" (3:22-23, кју). Later, when he was asked how he came to write the hymn, he said there were no special circumstances surrounding it, but he simply wrote about God's faithfulness from studying the Bible.
