

THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTS

"Yet all research in the United States today shows clearly that parents are by far the most important factor influencing their children's religion, not only as youth but also after they leave home."



THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTS

Parents define for their children the role that religious faith and practice ought to play in life, whether important or not... Parents set a "glass ceiling" of religious commitment above which their children rarely rise. Parental religious investment and involvement is in almost all cases the necessary and even sometimes sufficient condition for children's religious investment and involvement.



THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTS

Yet all empirical data tell us that, for intergenerational religious transmission today, the key agents are parents, not clergy or other religious professionals. The key location is the home, not religious congregations. And the key mechanisms of socialization are the formation of ordinary life practices and identities, not programs, preaching, or formal rites of passage. -HDTF p. 70

PARENTING STYLES

4 Primary Parenting Styles

Authoritarian – High Standards – Low Warmth – One Way

Communication

- Authoritative High Standards High Warmth High Communication
- Permissive Low Standards High Warmth Conflict Avoidant
- Uninvolved Low Standards Low Warmth Disengaged



AUTHORITATIVE PARENTING

"They found that parents who have warm and kind relationships with their children were more likely than others to pass on their religion and transmit similar levels of religious belief. He also found that parents who engaged in religious activities with their children when they were young were more likely to have adult children who were similarly religious."

PARENTS RELIGIOSITY

"The more important religion is to parents and the more parents attend religious services, the more important religion becomes for their children and the more their children attend religious services, even years after they no longer live with their parents."

VERBALLY COMMUNICATING THE FAITH

"By contrast, when parents talk naturally and substantively about religion and its place in life throughout the week, that effectively indicates to children that, in the mix of life's many priorities and values, this stuff matters a lot. And that raises the stakes for children's decisions about their own future religious commitments."

VERBALLY COMMUNICATING THE FAITH

Parents not talking about religion other than during scheduled "religious times" reinforces that compartmentalization. But when parents discuss religion with children during the week, it decompartmentalizes and desegregates religion. And the more naturally and regularly religion is talked about, the more normally it becomes a significant part of the world of the conversation participants.



THE ROLE OF THE CHURCH

"The last factor parents said was particularly important about congregations was "community." Parents described the importance of the congregational community as being different from school and other extracurricular activities."
