Baptism in another service. In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul writes: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his."

And, theologically at least, drowning is exactly what happens when we are baptized. And baptism is indeed about vulnerability. And about death. And about giving ourselves over to God and to the Church. In our baptism we die to the ways of sin. We die to all that would strive to separate us from God and from one another. We die to the forces of wickedness that conspire to claims us.
