

## *Ezra 5:1-2*

<sup>1b</sup> Now Haggai the prophet and Zechariah the prophet, a descendant of Iddo, prophesied to the Jews in Judah and Jerusalem in the name of the God of Israel, who was over them. <sup>2</sup> Then Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel and Joshua son of Jozadak set to work to rebuild the house of God in Jerusalem. And the prophets of God were with them, supporting them.



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## *Haggai 1:1-5*

<sup>1</sup> In the second year of King Darius, on the first day of the sixth month, the word of the Lord came through the prophet Haggai to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest: <sup>2</sup> This is what the Lord Almighty says: “These people say, ‘The time has not yet

come to rebuild the Lord's house.”

<sup>3</sup> Then the word of the Lord came through the prophet Haggai: <sup>4</sup> “Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin?”

<sup>5</sup> Now this is what the Lord Almighty says: “Give careful thought to your ways...”

## *Zechariah 1:1-6*

<sup>1</sup> In the eighth month of the second year of Darius, the word of the Lord came to the prophet Zechariah son of Berekiah, the son of Iddo: <sup>2</sup> “The Lord was very angry with your ancestors. <sup>3</sup> Therefore tell the people: This is what the Lord Almighty says: ‘Return to me,’

declares the Lord Almighty, 'and I will return to you,' says the Lord Almighty. <sup>4</sup> Do not be like your ancestors, to whom the earlier prophets proclaimed: This is what the Lord Almighty says: 'Turn from your evil ways and your evil practices.' But they would not listen or pay attention to me, declares the Lord.

## *Zechariah 1:1-6*

<sup>5</sup> Where are your ancestors now? And the prophets, do they live forever? <sup>6</sup> But did not my words and my decrees, which I commanded my servants the prophets, overtake your ancestors?

“Then they repented and said, ‘The Lord Almighty has done to us what our ways and practices deserve, just as he determined to do.’”



## *Ezra 5:11-12*

11 “We are the servants of the God of heaven and earth, and we are rebuilding the temple that was built many years ago, one that a great king of Israel built and finished.”

## *Ezra 5:11-12*

<sup>12</sup> But because our ancestors angered the God of heaven, he gave them into the hands of Nebuchadnezzar the Chaldean, king of Babylon, who destroyed this temple and deported the people to Babylon.”



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## *Ezra 6:19-22*

<sup>19</sup> On the fourteenth day of the first month, the exiles celebrated the Passover. <sup>20</sup> The priests and Levites had purified themselves and were all ceremonially clean. The Levites slaughtered the Passover lamb for all the exiles, for their relatives the priests and for themselves. <sup>21</sup> So the Israelites who had returned from the exile ate it, together with

all who had separated themselves from the unclean practices of their Gentile neighbors in order to seek the Lord, the God of Israel. <sup>22</sup> For seven days they celebrated with joy the Festival of Unleavened Bread, because the Lord had filled them with joy by changing the attitude of the king of Assyria so that he assisted them in the work on the house of God, the God of Israel.

## *Nehemiah 13*

- <sup>14</sup> Remember me for this, my God, and do not blot out what I have so faithfully done for the house of my God and its services.
- <sup>22</sup> Remember me for this also, my God, and show mercy to me according to your great love.
- <sup>29</sup> Remember them, my God, because they defiled the priestly office and the covenant of the priesthood and of the Levites.

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## *Jeremiah 31:31-34*

<sup>31</sup> “The days are coming,” declares the Lord, “when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah.

<sup>32</sup> It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them,” declares the Lord.

<sup>33</sup> “This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time,” declares the Lord. “I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.
