If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshipping with us on this Sunday morning.

Responsive Readings are one of the most ancient worship practices of God's people. Israel used readings like Psalm 136 as a lively call-and-response. When we engage in responsive readings, we connect with saints who lived long, long ago and share the delightful and creative practice of reading God's word together corporately.

Why pray the Lord's Prayer? We repeat the Lord's Prayer monthly not simply because "it's tradition." We do so because we realize that Jesus, in this prayer, gave us the model for how to pray. The prayer begins first with praise by recognizing that God is wholly "other" when compared to us ("Our Father, who art *in heaven*") and by proclaiming His holiness ("hallowed be Thy name"). It then moves into petition...asking God for things. But notice how the petitions begin—"Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done"—reminding us that we ask God for things according to His will. Thirdly, "give us this day our daily bread" reminds us to not even presuppose that the necessities of life come to us naturally...rather, they come from God's gracious hand. Likewise, forgiveness is not something we deserve, but something for which we must lean on God. Fourthly, the prayer ends with a humble acknowledgement of Who is in
