Psalms and the Reformed Tradition.

The conscious worshiper would notice that, over the summer, we've been utilizing the biblical psalms more and more for our call to worship. Many do not realize that the Reformation of the 16th century sought not only to reform the Church's doctrine but the church's worship. The Reformed tradition was especially concerned with bringing more Scripture back into the worship service, and this included an emphasis on the use of the only inspired, infallible "hymn book" ever written-the Psalms.

Remember your own baptism.

As we reflect on today's baptism at our 8:45am service, allow it to be a time of recommitment to the Lord. If you were baptized as an infant, think about how your baptism was a picture of your utter helplessness before God—how He found you, loved you, and clothed you with righteousness, even before you were able to choose and respond to Him. If you were baptized as an older child or adult, think about how your baptism was a conscious public profession before people that you would follow Christ. Allow God's covenant to be renewed in your life today.
