If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshipping with us on this Sunday morning.

Communion is just as much about the resurrection as it is about the cross.

"It should be abundantly clear, then, that the church was never meant to merely "remember" a *dead Jesus* at the Communion table. Believers indeed remember with profound reverence and gratitude the atoning death of Christ, as a core conviction of the faith, but in the New Testament, the death of Christ is integrally tied to the resurrection, apart from which it would not have spiritual power and meaning. 'He delivered over to death for our sins *and was raised to life for our justification*' (Rom 4:25). Cross and resurrection are distinguished but should never be separated in the faith and life of the church. Unfortunately, in the history of the Western church, and typically in modern evangelical churches, at the table the death of Christ is remembered, but with only a muted recollection of Christ's victory over death, and a largely absent sense of his actual, continuing spiritual presence with the church."
