# Worship Notes

If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshiping with us on this Sunday morning.

What is Lent? "Lent" comes from the Old English word *lenct* (meaning "spring"), which named the season often associated with this time period. Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, a 40-day countdown to Easter, intended to symbolize the 40 day temptation of Jesus in the wilderness, recorded in the Gospels (e.g. Matthew 4). There are actually more than 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter, but the church calendar doesn't count Sundays, since all Sundays are now the Lord's Day, the day of the week we celebrate Christ's resurrection.

Furthermore, Lent is a season of preparation as we look and move toward Holy Week (that week symbolizing Jesus' last week prior to the crucifixion and resurrection, where we celebrate days such as Good Friday and Easter). Traditionally, Christians take up practices during Lent which symbolize repentance, such as fasting. More important than our works, however, is remembering Jesus' work on our behalf. Lent is a great period to continually reflect on the fact that Jesus not only died for us, He *lived* for us. And His perfection and good works is the lens through which God looks at us when we put our faith in Him. He certainly died to pay the penalty for our sins. But He also lived to give us a righteousness we could never live out ourselves.
