Christ the King Sunday. Today marks the end of the year for the Church calendar. We're so used to sensing time in relation to the typical monthly calendar that we might often miss the richness of Sundays like these. The Christian calendar is, in many respects, a walk-through of the life of Christ. It therefore makes sense that on the final Sunday of the year we celebrate His crowning and perpetual reign. This reign is, in one respect, already happening. However, its fullness we have yet to see. One day, "every knee will bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord" (Philippians 2:10). This "already, not yet" tension of Christ's reign is precisely what we affirm today—celebration and longing, inauguration and consummation.

What does "Christ is King" really mean? In life, we are tempted so often to place religion in a box and Jesus in a certain sector of influence, ignoring Christ in our day-to-day lives.
