ing with us on this Sunday morning.

How the Lord's Prayer teaches us to pray. It's very normal for many Christians' prayers to be focused on individual needs and personal life. We're often consumed with praying for our immediate circumstances and the people, places, and events that we most regularly encounter. Praying the Lord's Prayer shapes us to be people who also pray "bigger" prayers. The Lord's Prayer lifts our heads and eyes to see the world a bit more from God's perspective. We pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name." We begin prayer with worship, reminding ourselves of God's greatness and grandeur. We pray, "Your kingdom come, Your will be done." This reminds us that our prayers are to be echoes of the heart and desires of God. Then, and only then, do we get to the "personal stuff." If you find yourself stuck in prayer or just going through the motions, remember what we pray every week and let the Lord's Prayer lift your head.
