## COVET:



#### Textual Commentary:

- 1. If there was a dispute among heirs it was customary to have a rabbi settle the dispute.
- 2. While Jesus is often called "rabbi" we have no reason to think he went through the process of becoming a rabbi—being God.
- 3. "Be on your guard" indicates that covetousness will grow slowly and quietly in your heart.
- 4. Security in abundance is no security at all. Possessions are not the welspring of life.

Luke 12:13-15

"13 Someone in the crowd said to him,
'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the
inheritance with me.' 14 But he said to him,
'Man, who made me a judge or arbitrator over
you?' 15 And he said to them, 'Take care, and
be on your guard against all covetousness, for
one's life does not consist in the abundance
of his possessions.""







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#### Textual Commentary:

- 5. This is not a poor person dreaming of a better life. This is a person with clear abundance of goods.
- 6. From abundance in the existing barns, he tears it all down to get MORE.
- 7. He convinces himself he is secure because of his great possessions.
- 8. Jesus is quoting Ecclesiastes 8:15 and Isaiah 22:15 to illustrate the emptiness of living for comfort.

Luke 12:16-20

"16 And he told them a parable, saying, 'The land of a rich man produced plentifully, 17 and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?' 18 And he said, 'I will do this: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. 19 And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.'"20 But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?""

King Solomon lamenting over the trivial pursuit of life's possessions (Eccl. 8:14-15).







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
## "If the dead are not raised, 'Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die."

Luke 12:21


"21 So is the one who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."
