





LIVE THE TEXT

Question for Christians: Are you being obedient to Christ? Are you being discipled and making disciples?

- 1. Share the gospel (Jesus suffered, died, rose from the dead, and offers repentance for the forgiveness of sins).
- 2. Search to find a disciple-maker that models Christ-like maturity (or a spiritual peer while you search) who can pour into your life.
- 3. As you grow in Christ, search for disciples. Invest your time, money, wisdom, prayers, words of encouragement AND rebuke with them. Look to Christ as your chief example for this.
