Memory Verse:

THE PROBLEM WITH COMPLAINING

- 1) Complaining <u>DISTORTS</u> my perspective.
- 2) Complaining keeps me from <u>GROWING</u> in my faith.
- 3) Complaining stops the flow of a <u>GRATEFUL</u> heart.

Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. – 1 Thessalonians 5:18

✓ Question: In my life, what do I complain about the most?

Do everything without grumbling or arguing, ¹⁵ so that you may become blameless and pure, "children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation." – Philippians 2:14-15

- If you can change your <u>CIRCUMSTANCES</u>, do something about it.
- If you can't change your circumstances, change your <u>PERSPECTIVE</u>.

Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that what has happened to me has actually served to advance the gospel. ¹³ As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ. - Philippians 1:12-13

TWO STATEMENTS TO HELP ME CHOOSE GRATITUDE

1) I will not let what I <u>WANT</u> rob me for what I <u>HAVE</u>.
