

## MORE THAN A FEELING

### Week 4: Jesus Loves Me

**Objective:** To challenge us to share the love of Jesus with others.

**1. The sermon emphasized going “back to basics” with this truth: JESUS LOVES ME.**

Why do you think we often move past that truth too quickly instead of living from it?

**2. Read 1 John 4:7–12 together.**

What stands out to you most in this passage about the nature of God’s love?

- What does it mean that “**God is love**”?
- How does that shape how you see your own life?

**3. The message made this connection:**

If Jesus loves me, I don’t just receive it — I share it.

Why is it important that love doesn’t stop with us?

**4. The sermon broke down John 3:16 into four simple truths:**

- **God Loved**
- **God Gave**
- **We Believe**
- **We Receive**

Which of those four feels most personally meaningful to you right now? Why?

**5. What’s the difference between believing *that* something is true and believing *in* (trusting in) something? How does that difference affect how we talk to others about faith?**

**6. The message said there are two simple ways to share God’s love:**

- **Show God’s love**
- **Tell others about God’s love**

Which one feels more natural to you?

Which one feels more challenging?

What would it look like to grow in the other one?

**Final Thought:**

The love of Jesus isn’t complicated.

**God loved. God gave. We believe. We receive.**

When that truth moves from your head to your heart, it changes how you see yourself—and how you see everyone else. The same love that saved you is the love God wants to send through you. We don’t just leave grateful. We leave commissioned.

**This Week:**

Do two intentional things:

**Receive It**

Spend a few minutes each day reminding yourself:

- God loved.
- God gave.
- I believe.
- I receive.

Let that truth settle in you.

## Share It

Ask God to show you one person in your life who needs to experience His love.

Then:

- **Show it** through a practical act of kindness, compassion, or encouragement.
- And when the opportunity opens, **tell it** — keep it simple:  
“I believe God loves you. He loved us enough to give His Son.”

Don't overcomplicate it. Just be faithful.
