UNITED WE STAND Part 3: Kingdoms in Conflict

Objective: To challenge us to focus our energy in fighting the right battle in the way that Jesus would.

From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.

22 Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"

23 Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

- What does it mean to you to give your allegiance fully to Jesus? What would you do
 if you discovered loyalty to Jesus meant you had to change/abandon some of your
 political views?
- When you think of Spiritual Warfare, what comes to mind? How can recognizing that our battle is a spiritual battle and not a battle against, "flesh and blood" change the way you approach those on the 'other side' of the political divide/culture war in our nation?

Consider this week:

 What can you do different than what you have been doing that will advance the true Kingdom of Jesus?

Final Thought: Rather than seeking to defeat our political enemies, focus on advancing the Kingdom of Jesus the same way Jesus did.
