## UNITED WE STAND Part 2: Serve Us or Service

**Objective:** To challenge us to be intentional about identifying and meeting the needs in our community.

In your relationships with one another, have the <u>same mindset as Christ Jesus</u>: 6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; 7 rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a <u>servant</u>, being made in human likeness. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death - even death on a cross! Philippians 2:5-8

Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. 26 Not so with you. Instead, <u>whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant</u>. 27 and <u>whoever wants to be first must be your slave</u>— 28 just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to <u>serve</u>, and to <u>give</u> his life as a ransom for many."

Matthew 20:25-28
