### Week 4: Live Sent

**Objective:** To challenge us to begin serving others, we no thought of repayment.

#### Icebreaker:

When you hear the phrase “**spiritual maturity**,” what comes to mind first?

- Knowledge? Behavior? Years in church? Something else?

#### 1. Knowledge vs. Love

The sermon challenged the idea that knowing more automatically means growing more.

- Why do you think it's so easy for us to equate spiritual maturity with knowledge rather than love?

#### 2. A Hard Look in the Mirror

Have you ever known (or been) someone who knew a lot about the Bible but didn't reflect much of Jesus' love?

- What effect does that disconnect have on others—and on our witness?

#### 3. Jesus Redefines Greatness

Read **Mark 10:35–45** together.

- What were James and John really asking for?
- How does Jesus completely redefine what greatness looks like in His kingdom?

#### 4. Modeled, Not Just Taught

Jesus didn't just talk about servant-hearted love—He lived it.

Read **John 13:14–15**.

- Why do you think Jesus chose foot-washing to demonstrate greatness?
- What does that tell us about how love shows up in everyday life?

#### 5. Knowing vs. Doing

Read **James 2:14–17**.

- What warning is James giving believers here?
- Where do you see the tension between belief and action in your own life?

#### 6. Love Gets Practical

The sermon said, “*Service turns belief into action.*”

**FINAL THOUGHT:** If we are going to live like Jesus and bring lasting transformation to our community, then we must start living as “one sent.”
