Discussion Sections

1. We Pray First

Scripture: Matthew 14:13; Philippians 4:6

- Why do you think Jesus' first response to difficult news was to withdraw and pray?
- What makes it easier to worry than to pray?
- How could our group become more intentional about "praying first" in daily life?

Application: Take time as a group to pray before moving on.

2. We Forgive Quickly

Scripture: Acts 7:59-60; Luke 23:34

- What stands out to you about Stephen's and Jesus' prayers of forgiveness?
- Why is forgiveness so central to following Jesus?



Who do you need to forgive quickly before bitterness grows?

Key Truth: We hate evil, not people.

3. We Live in Unity

Scripture: *John 17:20–21*

- What does Jesus' prayer teach us about the importance of unity?
- Where do you see division harming the witness of the Church today?
- How can our group demonstrate unity in a culture of division?

4. We Stay on Mission

Scripture: Acts 1:8; Ephesians 6:19-20; Romans 10:13

- What does it mean for you personally to be a witness "where you are"?
- Paul asked for boldness. Where do you need boldness to share your faith?
- How does knowing "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" encourage you?

5. We Do Good

Scripture: Romans 12:17-21; John 1:5

- How is "overcoming evil with good" countercultural?
- When have you seen someone's kindness break down barriers?
- What specific good can you do this week that will shine the light of Jesus in the darkness?



Reflection & Response

- Which of these five actions (pray first, forgive quickly, live in unity, stay on mission, do good) do you need to focus on most right now?
- How can we encourage one another to "not miss the moment" in this season?

Closing Prayer

Pray for unity, boldness, and opportunities to live out the way of Jesus in this moment. Ask God to use your group as light in the darkness.
