Talk About It

- 1. Who in your life has left a legacy for you and how has it impacted your life?
- 2. What do you want your legacy to be when you are gone?
- 3. Describe what you could be doing or, what you should be doing today to leave your legacy tomorrow.
- 4. Leaving a legacy is not restricted to finances (treasure); how can you leave a legacy through your time and talents as well?
- 5. Pastor Matt shared five reasons why he gives. Of the five, which one resonates with you the most and why?
- 6. Read Matthew 25:23. Today, God has entrusted certain opportunities and people to your care and stewardship. If you had a conversation with Jesus today, what would He say about your opportunity?
