## Discussion Guide - Blessed are the Poor in Spirit (Matthew 5:3)

#### Main Idea

This week, Pastor Matt kicked off our new series with the first of the Beatitudes: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven" (Matthew 5:3 NIV). Another way to say "poor in spirit" is "having an absolute need for God." Because we live in America, many of us don't realize how "poor" we really are spiritually. As Pastor Matt said, "We will never <u>depend</u> on something we don't think we <u>need</u>." But it's vital for us to recognize our need for God. Without Jesus, we pay for our own sins. Without Jesus, we can only cope through our pain and our personhood. Without Jesus, we try to find or create our own life. And without Jesus, we live our lives for joys that fade away. Jesus is our only hope for salvation, healing, redemption, and fulfillment. Let's recognize how much we need Him and depend on Him completely. If we live like this, we will experience the Kingdom of Heaven.

- Go to Jesus for the power to be healed and transformed.
- Go to Jesus to find out who you are and what your life is all about.
- Go to Jesus to experience the joy of living a life that glorifies God and impacts others.
