Sacred Life Genesis 4:1-9 What Does It Mean to See Life as Sacred?

- All of life, from conception to the grave, is good, valuable, and sacred, regardless of the views and opinions of society or culture.
- We are our brother's keeper. (Genesis 4:1-9)
- Cain's question echoes on into our society.
 - We fail to see the connectedness of our lives and try to live as though we have no real responsibility to see to the needs of others around us.
- Who is our brother? (Luke 10:25-37)
- The lawyer who asked Jesus the question, "who is my neighbor," was essentially asking the question, "who am I responsible for caring for?"
 - The story answers the question by saying all of us are neighbors, but few of us live that way.
- What does it mean to be our brother's keeper? (Leviticus 19:9-18; 32-36)
- It means loving those on the margins of society. (v. 9-10, 14, 33-35)
- The poor, the foreigner, the weak, the vulnerable, the disabled
- It means valuing truth, fairness, and integrity as an individual and in our systems of government and society. (v. 11, 16, 35-36)
 - It means using authority well. (v. 13)
 - It means loving justice and judging righteously. (v. 15).
 - It means being a deeply forgiving and forgiven people. (v. 17-18)
 - It means honoring people from the moment of conception to the moment of death. (v. 32)
