Interrupting Jesus Matthew 8:5-13

The Authority of Jesus and the Faith of a Centurion

- Compassion for others moves us to act boldly. (v. 5-7)
- The centurion was moved by compassion.
 - His compassion was "unnatural."
 - His compassion gave him courage.
- Comprehension of the authority of Jesus leads us to trust deeply. (v. 8-10)
- Jesus asks the centurion a question to push him to acknowledge a deep truth about Jesus (Shall I myself come and heal him?).
 - The centurion says that he is unworthy (hikanos), which reveals this man's sense of unworthiness in relation to Jesus' authority.
 - The centurion is able to see what no one else in Israel (which would include his own disciples) is able to see.
- Confidence in Jesus gives us fellowship with him. (v. 11-13)
- Jesus commends the faith of the centurion and explains that his faith has given him access to a very special table.
 - This table was believed to be only for the "sons of the kingdom," which many Jews took to mean only devout Jews.
 - In granting the Gentile centurion access to the table, Jesus is showing that faith is what ultimately provides people a way to fellowship with God.
