Building Strong Families How to Live in a Family Ephesians 4:25-32

- The family should be a place of honesty, which leads to belonging. (v. 25)
- The point here is that honesty binds us, which reinforces the reality that we are members of one another.
 - Deception and dishonesty divide us, which disintegrates the truth that we are members of one another.
 - "Honesty and transparency make you vulnerable. Be honest and transparent anyway." Mother Teresa
 - "Honesty is often very hard. The truth is often painful. But the freedom it can bring is worth the trying." Fred Rogers
- The family should be a place where we learn to deal with our emotions in a way that honors God and brings us closer together. (v. 26-27)
- Anger is information; sin is the action. (Logan)
 - When confronting those who have angered you, avoid using language like always and never. (Brian)
 - Dealing with anger appropriately is a way for us fight for the result of Jesus' prayer for the unity of His people. (John 17; see also Galatians 2:11-14)
- The family should be a place of hard work, which enables us to live generously with one another. (v. 28)
 - As Jesus has said, "It is better to give than to receive."
 - Our natural human inclination is to look out for ourselves and not to the interest of others.
 - Family can be an incredibly sanctifying place.
- The family should be a place where words build up, not diminish or destroy. (v. 29)
- Think about a person who said a timely word to you. (Greg)
 - Proverbs 15:1 "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."
 - Proverbs 15:4 "Kind words heal and help; cutting words wound and maim." (MSG)
 - Proverbs 18:21 "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit."
- Midrash: "The evil tongue slays three, the slanderer, the slandered, and the listener."
- Approximately 150 verses in Proverbs addresses our words (one out of every six).
- The family should be a place where the Holy Spirit transforms us. (v. 30-32)
- If we allow a place for bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, slander, or anger, then we will grieve the Holy Spirit.
 - If, however, we make room for kindness, tenderheartedness, and forgiveness, then we will be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit.
 - It is important to note that kindness, tenderheartedness, and forgiveness can only happen because we have experienced the kindness, tenderheartedness, and forgiveness of God in Christ Jesus.
 - An unwillingness to forgive is like making poison for someone else and then drinking it ourselves. (Greg)
 - Forgiveness does not make an action right or okay. (Stacie)
 - Forgiveness does not equal trust. (Brian)
