The Let Us Church Hebrews 10:19-22 Let Us Be Close

- The Church is supposed to be characterized by closeness.
- In this text alone, the author identifies his audience with familial language and talks about the house of God.
 - Other places in the NT talk about the Church as the Body of Christ (Romans 12:4-5; Ephesians 1:22-23), the Temple of God, the Household of God (Ephesians 2:19-22; 1 Peter 2:5).
- The closeness of the Church is only possible because of Christ.
- It is the blood, the flesh, of Jesus that makes it possible for us to enter the Holy Places.
 - The flesh of Jesus has replaced the curtain in the Temple (cf. John 14:6).
 - The Holy Places mentioned here are the reality of the Holy of Holies in the Temple, where only the high priest could enter once a year.
 - The Holy Places (i.e. the Holy of Holies) is the very presence of God (cf. Isaiah 6, Exodus 33:17-23, 1 Kings 19:9-13).
- The confidence created by the work of Christ allows us to draw near to God and to one another.
- We can and should have boldness to enter into the presence of God because of the finished work of Jesus.
 - His work has changed us.
 - We now have a true heart.
 - •We now have a clean conscience.
 - We now have a body set apart for God's purposes.
- All of this is due to the work of Jesus; it isn't dependent on our ability, goodness, or talents.
