## John 21:15-19

## When You Need to Be Restored

I. It can be hard to hear from Jesus when we have failed Him.

a. The context of this passage of restoration is Peter's betrayal of Jesus (see John 18:15-18; 25-27).

b. This is the same Peter who had been so strong in his attempts to follow Jesus and lead the others in following Jesus.

c. He allowed the fear of man to overpower his faith in Jesus.

II. Peter needed to be restored after his failure.

- a. His restoration needed to be specific.
- b. His restoration needed to be public.

c. His restoration was based on the grace and goodness of Jesus.

i. Peter didn't seek out restoration; Jesus sought him out.

ii. Peter wasn't good enough to be restored; Jesus knew everything about him and still restored him.

d. His restoration needed to reinstate Peter to his place in the fellowship.

e. His restoration needed to reaffirm Peter in his purpose in the fellowship.

f. His restoration prepared Peter for God's future plans for him.

III. The call to restoration is a call to continue to follow Jesus.
