Basic Similarities

God is One

Both Muslims and Christians believe in one God.

Man is Sinful

- ⊕ While Muslims believe everyone sins, they do not believe in _____ . (It is better to focus on people being sinners rather than on Adam's sin.)
- ⊕ Prophets (including Muhammad) sin and fall short of God's law, according to the Qur'an.

Jesus Christ

Muslims believe Jesus:

(Qur'an 4:171): "Christ Jesus the son of Mary was (no more than) an apostle of Allah, and His Word, which He bestowed on Mary, and a spirit proceeding from Him."

Note: Although the Qur'an agrees with the Bible that Jesus is the Word of God and the Spirit of God, Islamic leaders teach he was just a man who was never crucified and will return to earth someday

Holy Books

1. Tawrat—first five books of the Old Testament
2. Zabur—the Psalms
3. Injeel—New Testament, the Book of Jesus Christians look at all other religions through the lens of the New Testament.

Prophets

- ⊕ Adam
- ⊕ Noah
- ⊕ Abraham (God redeemed the son of Abraham with a ram. Muslims call this the Adha sacrifice.)
- ⊕ Jonah
- ⊕ John the Baptist

What The Bible Says about Jesus
John 1:1 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."
John 1:14 "The Word became flesh and took up residence among us. We observed His glory, the glory as the One and Only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."
Hebrews 1:1-2 "Long ago God spoke to the fathers by the prophets at different times and in different ways. In these last days, He has spoken to us by His Son. God has appointed Him heir of all things and made the universe through Him."
