The Incarnation

1Timothy 3:16 And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness:

God was manifested in the flesh,

Justified in the Spirit, Seen by angels, Preached among the Gentiles, Believed on in the world, Received up in glory.

What it means

- Jesus Christ is the eternal Second person of trinity. Who in time took upon Himself a complete human nature by being born of the Virgin Mary through the power of the Holy Spirit.

What it means

- He is truly God and truly human, possessing two natures, which are not confused, changed, devided, or separated.
- Eternal = never end is the world of God
- **-Time** = world of men. Full of time

Jesus Christ came from Eternity to the time = incarnation.

GOD

- Creator: God is uncreated one create everything
- Unseen One.

MANIFESTATION

- Revealed: Christ made God known to us
- **Proclaimed:** He brought God's word to us.

FLESH

- Material : Christ had a real human body
- Physical: He could be touched and felt.

John 1:14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

3. Significance of Jesus' Birth, Life, and Ministry:

• **Birth in Bethlehem**: Jesus' birth it fulfilled prophecies and marking the beginning of God's redemptive plan.

- Luke 1:35 35 And the angel answered and said to her, "*The* Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God. 36 Now indeed, Elizabeth your relative has also conceived a son in her old age; and this is now the sixth month for her who was called barren. 37 For with God nothing will be impossible."
- Life and Ministry: Jesus' life and ministry revealed God's character, brought salvation, and inaugurated God's kingdom on earth.
