

## Topic: Faithful Servants, Divine Rewards

Matthew 25:21

> “His lord said unto him, Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things; enter thou into the joy of thy lord.”

### INTRODUCTION

The greatest commendation in the Kingdom is not “well known,” but “well done.” In the parable of the talents, Jesus reveals that divine promotion is not based on position or popularity — it’s based on faithfulness. Thanksgiving for workers is not only to celebrate effort, but to awaken faithful hearts who serve until the Master returns.

#### Revelation:

God does not reward the busy, He rewards the faithful.  
Faithfulness is the currency of promotion in the Kingdom.

### 1 FAITHFULNESS IS A HEART POSTURE, NOT A TITLE

#### 1 Samuel 16:7

For the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart.”

#### Message:

Faithfulness begins in the heart, not in the hands. You can serve publicly and still not be faithful privately. The foundation of true service is purity of intention — serving because you love the Master, not because you want recognition.

#### Hebrew Word Insight:

**Emunah** (אֱמוּנָה) — means “steadfastness, trustworthiness, reliability.”

To be faithful (emunah) is to remain consistent, dependable, and loyal even when no one is watching.

#### Example:

David tended sheep in the wilderness while his brothers were in the army. He wasn’t in the spotlight, but he was faithful where God placed him. That same faithfulness promoted him to kingship.

**Revelation:**

Faithfulness in the small place qualifies you for a big assignment.

**2 FAITHFUL SERVANTS WORK AS UNTO THE LORD****Colossians 3:23–24**

And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men... for ye serve the Lord Christ.”

**Message:**

True servants don't serve for applause, but for approval from Heaven. When you serve “as unto the Lord,” your excellence becomes worship.

**Greek Word Insight:**

**Doulos** (δοῦλος) — “bond-servant or slave by choice.”

A doulos doesn't serve for salary, but out of love and devotion. Church workers are doulos of Christ—willing servants, joyfully submitted to His will.

**Example**

Joseph served faithfully in Potiphar's house, in prison, and in Pharaoh's palace. In every season, he served as unto God. His environment changed, but his faithfulness never did.

**Revelation:**

Your location may change, but your devotion must remain constant. Faithful servants carry the same spirit everywhere they go.

**3 FAITHFULNESS OPENS THE DOOR TO DIVINE PROMOTION****Luke 16:10–12**

“He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much...”

**Message:**

Promotion in God's Kingdom doesn't come by request—it comes by trust. God doesn't promote workers based on prayer, but based on proven loyalty.

**Revelation:**

Faithfulness is the test before enlargement. Before God gives you more, He will test how you manage the little.

If you are faithful in small assignments, God can trust you with bigger responsibilities.

**Example:**

The servants with two and five talents both received the same reward because God values faithfulness, not quantity. The size of your assignment doesn't determine your reward — your faithfulness does.

**Prophetic Word:**

You have been faithful in the shadows; now God will bring you into the spotlight. Your hidden labour will birth public elevation!"

**4 FAITHFUL SERVANTS REFLECT THE CHARACTER OF GOD**

**Deuteronomy 7:9**

"Know therefore that the Lord thy God, he is God, the faithful God..."

**Message:**

To serve faithfully is to reflect God's own nature. The Father Himself is faithful — unchanging, constant, and dependable. When you remain faithful in service, you reveal the image of your Master.

**Revelation:**

Faithfulness is not just something you do; it's who you become. It transforms you into a vessel of divine trust.

**Example:**

Daniel's faithfulness in prayer and integrity made him stand out even among unbelievers. The Bible says, "an excellent spirit was in him" (Daniel 6:3). Faithfulness attracts divine excellence and supernatural favour.

**5 FAITHFULNESS IS ALWAYS REWARDED**

**Hebrews 11:6**

"For he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him."

**Message:**

Every faithful act is recorded in Heaven. God may not pay every Friday, but He pays faithfully. Some rewards are immediate (favor, joy, provision), while others are eternal (crowns, glory, and divine commendation).

**Revelation:**

Faithfulness has a voice — it speaks in seasons of remembrance.

Your “Well done” moment is coming.

**Example:**

Mordecai served faithfully at the king’s gate. For years, nothing happened. But one night, God interrupted the king’s sleep (Esther 6:1–3). His faithfulness summoned divine remembrance.

**Prophetic Revelation:**

There are kings who cannot sleep until your name is mentioned. Your faithfulness will provoke divine remembrance!” 🔥

**CONCLUSION**

Every faithful servant is a partner with God. You are not just working for the church—you are building the Kingdom. Your hands are writing history in Heaven.

**Revelation:**

Faithfulness today is the seed for your future greatness.

When the Master returns, may He find you doing what He called you to do—with joy, humility, and endurance.
