Jacob lays down to rest, using a stone as a pillow, and dreams of a ladder reaching from earth to heaven, with angels ascending and descending. In this dream, God stands above the ladder, affirming the covenant with Jacob's ancestors and promising His presence and protection. Jacob awakens, declaring, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I wasn't even aware of it!"

Imagine the profound impact of this encounter on Jacob's life. From that moment on, he's a changed man
