Lesson Title: Let There Be Real

Key Verses: John 2:13-17; Jer 7:3-10; Jude 1:4; Eph. 6:10-17; Isa. 59-16-17 (NKJV)

Summary

The sermon emphasizes the need for zeal and revival within the church, calling for a return to sacredness and holiness by cleansing hypocrisy and false doctrines, and encouraging believers to live righteously and boldly for God amid societal pressures.

- 4. The pastor emphasized the need to "live right boldly and unapologetically." What challenges might we face in doing this? How can we overcome them?

Practical Applications

- 1. **Self-examination**: Take time this week to prayerfully examine your life. Are there areas where you've compromised your faith or blurred the lines between sacred and secular?
- 2. **Prioritize Sacredness and Holiness**: Set boundaries that differentiate between what is sacred and what is secular. Ensure that your actions, especially in places of worship, honor the sanctity of God's presence. Avoid behaviors that commercialize or diminish the sacredness of your spiritual life.
- 3. Address and Heal from Church Hurts: If you've been hurt by the church or religious leaders, seek healing and reconciliation. Remember that God's character is not defined by human failures. Consider counseling or support groups if needed, and focus on rebuilding your faith in God's love and truth.
